He was employed by Corning Glass Works in Central 9 10 Falls for over twenty years. In 1985 Mr. Wildenhain was appointed by Governor J. Joseph 11 Garrahy as an advocate for Workers' Compensation in the State of Rhode Island, a position he 12 held until his retirement in 2005; and 13 WHEREAS, Dedicated to public service, Mr. Wildenhain was a member of the 14 Pawtucket School Committee for two terms. He was then elected to the Pawtucket City Council 15 in 1997. As a City Councilman, Paul served on various committees and was the Chairman of the Animal Control Committee. Paul was a strong advocate for the Pawtucket Police Department's 16 17 DARE Program; and 18 WHEREAS, In addition, Paul was a dedicated citizen to his country, serving proudly in 19 the United States Navy for many years. He lived his life to be involved in the betterment of his

J. Wildenhain, so must we celebrate the spirit, generosity, and courage with which he lived every
day of his life; and
