### SENATE RESOLUTION

# EXPRESSING PROFOUND SYMPATHY ON THE PASSING OF MARK P. MALKOVICH, III

1 WHEREAS, It is with great sadness that this Senate has learned of the passing of Mark P. 2 Malkovich, III, a legendary music impresario who nurtured and gave voice to hundreds of musicians and whose creative vision brought life and world-wide acclaim to Newport's Music 3 4 Festival; and WHEREAS, Born in the small mining town of Eveleth, Minnesota, Mark Malkovich 5 discovered music at an early age. In third grade, he took up the clarinet, and at the age of fifteen, 6 7 he began studying the piano. At Columbia, he studied chemistry, but music continued to inspire 8 him. While working in the chemical industry, he took piano lessons at Juilliard; and 9 WHEREAS, Mark Malkovich knew that music could tell a story and express a soul's magnificent and powerful beauty. From his first year at the helm of Newport's Music Festival in 10 11 1975, he took chances and trusted his instincts. He convinced Soviet authorities to allow Andrei 12 Gavrilov to appear at the festival, an event that would mark the very first time a Soviet musician 13 would be allowed to play in the West, and a decision that firmly established Malkovich's presence 14 in the festival; and 15 WHEREAS, With a lifelong passion for music, an uncanny ability to recognize talent, and a gift for promotion, Mark Malkovich built Newport's Music Festival into a haven for diverse 16 and fine music and a world-renowned, not-to-be-missed musical event. And although many of 17 the Festival's performers hailed from around the world, Malkovich considered them "family" 18

1	WHEREAS, As much an icon as the musicians he chose and enticed to Newport, Mark
2	Malkovich's larger than life personality is described by friends as 'butgoing, gregarious, and
3	ready to greet one and all with a great hug"; and
4	WHEREAS, Mr. Malkovich eventually relinquished some of the day-to-day planning of
5	the festival to his son, Mark, IV, but had continued to have a hand in the selection and
6	recruitment of the musicians. He was joyfully married for more than fifty-one years to his wife,
7	Joan, and in addition to his son Mark, he was the father of Kent, Erik, and Cara; and
8	WHEREAS, Mark Malkovich's passing leaves a tremendous void not only in the hearts
9	of his beloved family and many friends, but also in Newport's Music Festival. His body of
10	professional work leaves a distinguished legacy whose impact can be felt not only in the rhythm
11	and melodies of the Festival he helped create, but also in the countless lives that his musical
12	vision touched and inspired; now, therefore be it
13	RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations
14	hereby joins the family and many friends and admirers of Mark P. Malkovich, III, in mourning
15	his untimely passing. He will forever be remembered for his passion for life and his all-
16	consuming love of music; and be it further
17	RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and he hereby is authorized and directed to
18	transmit duly certified copies of this resolution to Mrs. Joan Malkovich and Family.
