Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill will have no impact on expenditures of the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) because it does not operationally impact the agency.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 12, 2021

State Expenditure

This bill revises the permitted level of light transmission suncreening devices installed on the windshield, side windows, and rear window of a motor vehicle. Currently, the level is twenty-seven percent; this bill changes the level to twenty percent. There is no violation for a motor vehicle with a sunscreen device that complied with the twenty-seven percent level before January 1, 2021, so long as the original sunscreen device is in place. Since this bill does not operationally affect DMV, there is no expenditure impact on the agency.
