This bill enables a party in a divorce hearing to submit to the court an affidavit in support of the divorce if the grounds for divorce is that the parties have lives separate and apart for at least one year and the parties have resolved all issues, there are no other matters of the divorce to be adjudicated, and the adverse party has been served and has failed to respond or appear in court.
