Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill removes those code sections specifying that the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) is responsible for the establishment and expansion of child development services.

Pursuant to Executive Order No. 2003-26, administration of the Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) and the Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) program were transferred from DHHS to the Department of Social Services (DSS) in 2003. DHHS no longer operates these programs and does not receive any appropriations for these programs. Therefore, this bill will have no fiscal impact on DHHS or local counties.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 10, 2023

State Expenditure

This bill removes those code sections specifying that DHHS is responsible for the establishment and expansion of child development services.

DHHS stated that Executive Order No. 2003-26 transferred the administration of the CCDF and the SSBG program from DHHS to DSS. This bill is an update to the code to reflect current practices and according to DHHS will have no fiscal impact for the agency.
