1 **An Act to limit the scope of medical information that may be required as a condition**
 2 **of participation in sanctioned activities.**

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 **Section 1.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

5 **13-36-15. Student medical information--Release--Limitations.**

6 Except as otherwise provided in this section, the board of a school district may not
 7 require that, as a condition of a student's participation in any activity sanctioned by an
 8 association meeting the requirements of § 13-36-4, the student's parent provide the
 9 district with a signed document authorizing a health care provider to release or disclose
 10 the student's medical information.

11 The board of a school district may require that, as a condition of a student's
 12 participation in any activity sanctioned by an association meeting the requirements of
 13 § 13-36-4, the student's parent provide to the district a copy of the student's physical
 14 examination form, signed by a doctor of medicine, a doctor of osteopathy, a doctor of
 15 chiropractic, a nurse practitioner, or a physician assistant, and if a physical examination
 16 is not required on an annual basis, the student's annual interim pre-participation medical
 17 history form, signed by the student's parent and certifying that the student is physically
 18 able to participate in an activity.

19 Information provided under this section is deemed to be part of the student's
 20 educational record and may be utilized by school district personnel only to:

- 21 (1) Verify the student's physical ability to participate in a sanctioned activity;
 22 (2) Identify any limitations on the student's physical ability to participate in a
 23 sanctioned activity; and
 24 (3) Participate in any of the student's treatment protocols, provided the protocols are
 25 determined by a health care provider working under the provider's scope of
 26 practice and the participation is at the direction of the provider.
