1	An Act to establish criteria governing the sale of homemade food items.
2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
3	Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added:
4	7-18A-38. Homemade food itemOrdinance limitation.
5	A board of county commissioners may not pass an ordinance that restricts,
6	prohibits, or imposes any licensure requirement or licensure fee on the sale of any
7	homemade food item, as defined in § 34-18-1.
8	Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added:
9	8-5-15. Homemade food itemOrdinance limitation.
10	A township board of supervisors may not pass an ordinance that restricts, prohibits,
11	or imposes any licensure requirement or licensure fee on the sale of any homemade food
12	item, as defined in § 34-18-1.
13	Section 3. That a NEW SECTION be added:
14	9-19-22. Homemade food itemOrdinance limitation.
15	The governing board of a municipality may not pass an ordinance that restricts,
16	prohibits, or imposes any licensure requirement or licensure fee on the sale of any
17	homemade food item, as defined in § 34-18-1.
18	Section 4. That § 34-18-1 be AMENDED.
19	34-18-1. Definitions.
20	Terms used in this chapter mean:
21	(1) "Campground," a plot of ground for public use upon which two or more campsites

are located, established, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public to be a

1		place where camping units can be located and occupied as temporary living quarters
2		for children or adults, or both. Camping units are considered to be trailers, tent
3		campers, campers, tents, recreational park trailers, or other equipment that may
4		be used by the public at individual campsites located at campgrounds or areas used
5		by the public as campgrounds;
6	(2)	"County fair," any fair or celebration operated by any county of this state and under
7		the supervision of a county fair board, county fair association, or the county board
8		of commissioners;
9	(3)	"Department," the Department of Health;
10	(4)	"Food," any raw, cooked, or processed edible substance, beverage, or ingredient
11		used or intended for use or for sale in whole or in part for human consumption;
12	(5)	"Food service establishment," any fixed restaurant; coffee shop; cafeteria; short-
13		order café; luncheonette; grill; tearoom; sandwich shop; soda fountain; tavern;
14		bar; cocktail lounge; night club; roadside stand; catering kitchen; delicatessen;
15		bakery; grocery store; boardinghouse; or similar place in which food or drink is
16		prepared for sale or for service to the public on the premises or elsewhere with or
17		without charge;
18	(6)	"Homemade food item," any food, including a nonalcoholic beverage, that is
19		produced and, if applicable, packaged at the residence of the producer;
20	<u>(7)</u>	Hotel," any hotel, motel, lodge, resort, cabins, building, or buildings with more
21		than ten rental units which is used to provide sleeping accommodations for a charge
22		to the public;
23	(7)<u>(</u>8	3) "Lodging establishment," any building or other structure and property or premises
24		kept, used, maintained, advertised or held out to the public to be a place where
25		sleeping accommodations are furnished for pay to two or more transient guests.
26		The term includes hotels, motels, cabins, bed and breakfast establishments, lodges,
27		vacation home establishments, dude ranches, and resorts;
28	(8) (9	2) "Mobile food service establishment," any mobile unit in which food or drink is
29		prepared for sale or for service to the public with or without charge;
30	(9)<u>(1</u>	<u>10)</u> "Nonprofit organization," any governmental organization, church, fraternal, social,
31		school, youth, or other similar organization that is organized and operated for a
32		common good and not for the specific monetary gain of any person or persons;
33	<u>(11)</u>	"Nontemperature-controlled item," a homemade food item that does not, for
34		purposes of safety, require a time or temperature control process to limit
35		pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation;

1	(10) (12)	"Owner," the operator, agent, proprietor, manager, or licensee whether it be
2	a per	son, firm, corporation, limited liability company, or association;
3	<u>(13) "Prod</u>	uce," to prepare a homemade food item by baking, canning, cooking, cutting,
4	<u>dehy</u>	drating, drying, fermenting, growing, mixing, preserving, raising, or other
5	<u>simila</u>	ar action;
6	(11)<u>(14)</u>	"Rental unit," any room, cabin, or other quarters that may be rented to a
7	guest	for sleeping accommodations;
8	(12)<u>(15)</u>	"Secretary," the secretary of the Department of Health;
9	(13)<u>(16)</u>	"Specialty resort," any bed and breakfast establishment, lodge, dude ranch,
10	resor	t, building, or buildings used to provide accommodations or recreation for a
11	charg	e to the public, with no more than ten rental units for up to an average of
12	twent	ty guests per night and in which meals are provided to only the guests staying
13	at the	e specialty resort;
14	(14)<u>(17)</u>	"State Fair," the fair at Huron, South Dakota, operated by the Department of
15	Agric	ulture;
16	<u>(18) "Tem</u>	perature-controlled item," a homemade food item that does, for purposes of
17	safety	y, require a time or temperature control process to limit pathogenic
18	<u>micro</u>	organism growth or toxin formation;
19	(15)<u>(19)</u>	"Temporary food service establishment," any food service establishment
20	which	operates at a fixed location for a temporary period of time, not to exceed two
21	week	s, in connection with a fair, carnival, circus, public exhibition, or similar
22	transi	itory gathering;
23	(16)<u>(20)</u>	"Transient guest," any person who resides in a lodging establishment less
24	than	four consecutive calendar weeks;
25	(17)<u>(21)</u>	"Vacation home establishment," any home, cabin, or similar building that is
26	rente	d, leased, or furnished in its entirety to the public on a daily or weekly basis
27	for m	ore than fourteen days in a calendar year and is not occupied by an owner or
28	mana	ger during the time of rental. This term does not include a bed and breakfast
29	estab	lishment as defined in subdivision 34-18-9.1(1);
30	(18) (22)	"Water recreational facility," any artificial basin of water located at a facility
31	licens	ed pursuant to chapter 34-18 constructed, installed, modified, or improved
32	for th	ne purpose of swimming, wading, diving, or recreation, including swimming
33	pools	, spas, hot tubs, and water slides.

7		No canned good may be sold unless the pH level is 4.6 or less or the water activity	
8	level is .85 or less. A third-party processing authority with knowledge of the thermal		
9	processing required of food in hermetically sealed containers shall verify the method of		
10	processing and that the pH or water activity threshold levels are met. The processing		
11	autho	rity shall provide any such verification in writing.

14		Unless otherwise provided in this section, no baked good A homemade food item	
15	or ca	nned good may <u>not</u> be sold unless it has a label that -includes the following	
16	inforn	nation:	
17	(1)	Name States the name of the product;	
18	(2)	Name-States the name of the producer;	
19	(3)	Physical States the physical address of production;	
20	(4)	Mailing States the mailing address of the producer;	
21	(5)	Telephone States the telephone number of the producer;	
22	(6)	Date <u>States</u> the date the product was made or processed;	
23	(7)	IngredientsLists the ingredients; and	
24	(8)	A disclaimer that states Includes the following disclaimers:	
25		(a) "This product food was not produced in a commercial kitchen. It has been	
26		home-processed in a kitchen that may also process common food allergens	
27		such as tree nuts, peanuts, eggs, soy, wheat, milk, fish, and crustacean	
28		shellfish that is regulated or inspected."; and	
29		(b) "This food may contain allergens."

2		Any person selling non-temperature-controlled baked goods at the person's
3	prima	ry residence homemade food items is exempt from the licensing and license fee
4	provis	sions of this chapter, if the following conditions are met, where applicable:
5	(1)	The non-temperature controlled baked goods homemade food items meet the
6		requirements of § 34-18-37;
7	(2)	The non-temperature-controlled baked goods are sold in the seller's physical
8		presence at:
9		(a) The seller's primary residence;
10		(b) A farmer's market;
11		(c) A roadside stand; or
12		(d) Other temporary sale venue; and
13	(3) Th	e seller, or a person residing at the seller's primary residence, personally delivers
14	the no	on-temperature-controlled baked goods to the buyer at the completion of the saleAny
15	home	made food items that are nontemperature-controlled are sold and delivered to the
16	purch	aser by:
17		(a) The producer, either in person or remotely, including by telephone or
18		internet;
19		(b) An agent of the producer; or
20		(c) A third-party vendor, including a retail or grocery store;
21	<u>(3)</u>	Any homemade food items that are temperature-controlled are:
22		(a) Sold to the purchaser by the producer, either in person or remotely,
23		including by telephone or internet; and
24		(b) Delivered to the purchaser in person;
25	<u>(4)</u>	The homemade food item is not a meat food product, as that term is defined in the
26		Federal Meat Inspection Act, 21 U.S.C § 601, as of January 1, 2021, unless it is
27		exempted in accordance with 9 C.F.R. § 303.1;
28	<u>(5)</u>	The homemade food item is not a poultry product, as that term is defined in the
29		Poultry Products Inspection Act, 21 U.S.C § 453, as of January 1, 2021, unless it
30		is exempted in accordance with 9 C.F.R. § 381.10(c) or (d); and
31	<u>(6)</u>	The person's annual gross revenue from selling homemade food items does not
32		exceed one hundred fifty thousand dollars.

33 **Section 9.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

1	34-18-39. Homemade food itemsRetailerRequired signage.
2	A retailer selling homemade food items shall display a sign informing the end
3	consumer that the homemade food items have not been inspected.
4	Section 10. That § 34-46-17 be AMENDED.
5	34-46-17. Posted smoking rooms permitted in hotels and lodging
6	establishments.
7	The provisions of §§ 34-46-13 to 34-46-15, inclusive, do not apply to any sleeping
8	rooms in any hotel or lodging establishment licensed pursuant to subdivision 34-18-1(7)
9	or (9), respectively chapter 34-18, if the rooms are rented to guests. Any sleeping room
10	in which smoking is allowed shall be posted as a smoking room.
11	Section 11. That § 34-18-35 be REPEALED.
