## HOUSE BILL NO. 1199

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the minimum age to
- 2 procure hunting and fishing licenses.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 41-6-12 be amended to read:
- 5 41-6-12. Any person who is a resident of this state, as defined by this title, qualifies as
- 6 resident for securing any resident hunting or fishing license or preference points. All other
- 7 persons shall secure the applicable nonresident hunting and fishing licenses or preference points.
- 8 No person under the age of twelve years may be granted any hunting license or preference point.
- 9 However, any person who is eleven years of age and who will become twelve years of age
- during the period September first through December thirty-first, inclusive, may be granted any
- 11 hunting license or preference point and be allowed to hunt beginning September first.
- 12 Section 2. That § 41-6-13 be amended to read:
- 13 41-6-13. A resident hunting license may be issued only to a resident sixteen years of age or
- older. However, the parent or guardian of a resident who is less than sixteen years of age and

- 1 meets the age requirements of § 41-6-12 may apply for the license for such person. If a license
- 2 is granted on the application, the license authorizes hunting by the person only if accompanied
- 3 by a parent, guardian, or responsible adult and is valid for the license year as provided by the
- 4 applicable license and rules promulgated by the Game, Fish and Parks Commission pursuant
- 5 to chapter 1-26. The requirement to be accompanied by an adult no longer applies when the
- 6 licensee attains sixteen years of age. A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.
- 7 Section 3. That § 41-6-14 be amended to read:
- 8 41-6-14. Any person between the ages of eleven years and under the age of sixteen years
- 9 shall first comply with the provisions of chapter 41-7, pertaining to firearms safety, before being
- granted a resident hunting license or the applicable nonresident hunting licenses.
