A LEGISLATIVE COMMEMORATION, Honoring the life and public service of former State Representative Hal Wick on the occasion of his death on March 7, 2018.

WHEREAS, Hal Gerard Wick was born in New Ulm, Minnesota on October 31, 1944, graduated from O'Gorman High School in Sioux Falls in 1962, and earned a Bachelor of Science degree at South Dakota State University in 1967; and

WHEREAS, Hal Wick served as a pilot with Northwest Airlines from 1972 until his retirement in 2004; and

WHEREAS, Hal Wick's family includes wife, Jane, and four children including daughters, Anne, Paula Jo, and Betsey, and son, Ross; and

WHEREAS, Hal Wick served in the South Dakota House of Representatives from 1977 to 1980, from 1995 to 1998, from 2001 to 2008, and again in 2011 to 2014 for a total of twenty years; and
