- 2 undermine agricultural producers.
- WHEREAS, South Dakota's rich history is primarily based on agriculture and agricultural
- 4 products; and
- 5 WHEREAS, South Dakota's economy is largely based on agricultural goods and services;
- 6 and
- WHEREAS, agriculture has a twenty-one billion dollar impact on our state economy; and
- 8 WHEREAS, our rural heritage and future well-being depend primarily on a strong
- 9 agricultural base; and
- WHEREAS, animal agriculture is a critical component of South Dakota's economy and
- 11 agricultural infrastructure; and
- WHEREAS, farmers and ranchers understand the importance of humane treatment and care
- of all farm animals; and

- WHEREAS, misleading information has negatively impacted the agriculture industry; and
- WHEREAS, extreme animal rights organizations pose a significant risk to agricultural
- 3 producers and the agricultural community in South Dakota and in the nation as a whole:
- 4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-
- 5 Eighth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, opposes any
- 6 attempt for any ballot initiative or acts by the Humane Society of the United States, People for
- 7 the Ethical Treatment of Animals, and other animal rights groups that would undermine the
- 8 livelihood of agricultural producers.
