1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to define a final stage manufacturer dealer and to provide 2 for licensing of final stage manufacturer dealers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 4 Section 1. That § 32-6B-1 be amended to read as follows: 5 32-6B-1. Terms as used in this chapter mean: 6 (1) "Administrator," the administrator of the dealer licensing and inspection program of the Department of Revenue; 8 (2) "Auctioneer," a person who presides over a public auction where following an initial 9 starting price, bids are taken from two or more people until a final bid or price is 10 established for a motor vehicle; 11 "Authorized emergency vehicle," any vehicle of a fire department and any ambulance 12 and emergency vehicle of a municipal department or public service corporation that 13 are designated or authorized by the Department of Public Safety; 14 (3) "Broker," a person who, for a fee, commission, or other valuable consideration, 15 arranges or offers to arrange a transaction involving the sale or exchange of vehicles,

2		(a) A dealer or a bona fide agent or employee of a dealer;
3		(b) A representative or a bona fide agent or employee of a manufacturer; or
4		(c) At any point in the transaction the bona fide owner of the vehicle involved in
5		the transactions;
6	(4)	"Community," the franchisee's area of responsibility as stipulated in the franchise. A
7		community has a minimum radius of ten miles around an existing dealership;
8	(5)	"Converter," a person who modifies or installs on previously assembled chassis
9		special bodies or equipment which, when completed, form an integral part of the
10		vehicle and which constitutes a major manufacturing alteration and who may issue
11		a supplemental or secondary statement of origin;
12	(6)	"Demonstration," the noncommercial use of a dealer owned vehicle by any employee
13		of the dealership for any purpose in the ordinary course of business relating to the
14		sale of the vehicle within the trade or market area of the dealership or demonstration
15		by any prospective buyer for a period of three days. The term includes vehicles
16		donated by a dealership to a community or organization and used for a one-day
17		parade or event;
18	(6A)	"Department," the Department of Revenue;
19	(6B)	"Emergency vehicle dealer," any person who converts or manufacturers authorized
20		emergency vehicles and who, for commission or with intent to make a profit or gain,
21		sells, exchanges, rents with option to purchase, offers, or attempts to negotiate a sale
22		or exchange of new, or new and used authorized emergency vehicles, or who is
23		engaged wholly or in part in the business of selling new, or new and used authorized

emergency vehicles;

1	(7)	"Franchise," a written or oral agreement or contract between a franchisor and		
2		franchisee which fixes the legal rights and liabilities of the parties to such agreement		
3		or contract;		
4	(8)	"Franchisee," person who receives vehicles from a franchisor under a franchise and		
5		who offers and sells the vehicles to the general public;		
6	(9)	"Franchisor," any person engaged in the manufacturing or distribution of vehicles		
7		including any person who acts for the franchisor;		
8	(9A)	"Good faith," honesty in fact and the observance of reasonable, nondiscriminatory		
9		commercial standards of fair dealing in the trade, as defined and interpreted in the		
10		Uniform Commercial Code as amended to January 1, 2010;		
11	(10)	"In-transit," the noncommercial use of a dealer owned vehicle by any employee of the		
12		dealership for travel to and from any service facility, detail shop, repair shop, gas		
13		station, car wash, dealer auction, another lot owned by the dealer, a supplemental lot,		
14		temporary special events lot, temporary supplemental lot, or any other location to		
15		facilitate a dealer trade;		
16	(10A)	"Manufacturer," a person who manufactures or assembles vehicles, including motor		
17		homes, and who issues the original or first manufacturer's statement of origin. The		
18		term, manufacturer, includes a central or principal sales corporation through which		
19		it distributes its products to franchised dealers;		
20	(11)	"Motor home," a motor vehicle designed as an integral unit to be used as a		
21		conveyance upon the public highways and for use as a temporary or recreational		
22		dwelling and having at least four of the following permanently installed systems:		
23		(a) Cooking facilities;		
24		(b) Ice box or mechanical refrigerator;

1		(c)	Potable water supply including plumbing and a sink with faucet either self-
2			contained or with connections for an external source, or both;
3		(d)	Self-contained toilet connected to a plumbing system with connection for
4			external water disposal;
5		(e)	Heating or air conditioning system, or both, separate from the vehicle engine
6			or the vehicle electrical system;
7		(f)	A one hundred tenone hundred fifteen volt alternating current electrical
8			system separate from the vehicle engine electrical system either with its own
9			power supply or with a connection for an external source, or both, or a
10			liquified petroleum system and supply;
11	(12)	"Pub	lic auction," a business that is open to the public where South Dakota titled
12		moto	or vehicles are consigned, displayed, and auctioned to the highest bidder by ar
13		aucti	oneer;
14	(12A)) "Rec	reational park trailer," a vehicle that is primarily designed to provide temporary
15		living	g quarters for recreational, camping, or seasonal use and which:
16		(a)	Is built on a single chassis mounted on wheels;
17		(b)	Has a gross trailer area not exceeding four hundred square feet in the setup
18			mode;
19		(c)	Is certified by the manufacturer as complying with American National
20			Standards Institute Standard No. A119.5 in effect on January 1, 2008; and
21		(d)	Has at least a seventeen digit identification number and the manufacturer has
22			designated the vehicle as a recreational park model on the manufacturer
23			statement of origin;
24	(13)	"Sell	-it-yourself lot," any space provided to a person for a fee to display that person's

boat or vehicle for sale;

- (14) "Semitrailer," any vehicle of the trailer type, equipped with a kingpin assembly, designed and used in conjunction with a fifth wheel connecting device on a motor vehicle and constructed so that some part of its weight and that of its load rests upon or is carried by another vehicle;
- (15) "Supplemental lot," a physically separate location owned and maintained by a licensed dealer within the same county as the principal place of business;
 - (16) "Temporary special events lot," a location other than the principal place of business, supplemental lot, or temporary supplemental lot where a licensed trailer dealer, a licensed used car dealer selling only truck tractors, travel trailers, or motor homes, or any combination thereof, or a licensed vehicle dealer selling only truck tractors, travel trailers, or motor homes, or any combination thereof, may conduct business for a period of time not to exceed ten consecutive days for a specific purpose such as fairs, auctions, shopping center sales, or tent sales. A temporary special events lot shall meet all local zoning and building codes for the type of business being conducted;
 - or supplemental lot," a location other than the principal place of business or supplemental lot but within the same county as the principal place of business, or within the corporate limits of a municipality which overlaps boundaries of a county, or in an adjoining county, if the adjoining county has no licensed vehicle dealer selling automobiles, pick-ups, or passenger vans and the temporary supplemental lot is no more than ten miles from the principal place of business, where a licensed vehicle dealer or a licensed used vehicle dealer may conduct business for a period of time not to exceed ten consecutive days for a specific purpose such as fairs, auto

shows, auctions, shopping center promotions, or tent sales. A temporary supplemental lot shall meet all local zoning and building codes for the type of business being conducted. If a licensed vehicle dealer establishes a temporary supplemental lot in a county with a licensed used vehicle dealer, a licensed used vehicle dealer may establish a temporary supplemental lot in a county with a licensed vehicle dealer. A licensed vehicle dealer may establish, for manufacturer sponsored events, a temporary supplemental lot in an adjoining county that has no like franchised licensed dealer;

- (18) "Trailer," any vehicle without motive power designed to be coupled to or drawn by a motor vehicle and constructed so that no part of its weight or that of its load rests upon the towing vehicle;
- (19) "Trailer dealer," any person who, for commission or with intent to make a profit or gain, sells, exchanges, rents with option to purchase, offers or attempts to negotiate a sale or exchange of new or used trailers, semitrailers or travel trailers or who is engaged in the business of selling new or used trailers, semitrailers or travel trailers whether or not such vehicles are owned by such person;
- (20) "Travel trailer," any trailer or semitrailer which provides as its primary purpose adequate, comfortable, temporary living quarters while on pleasure excursions or while touring for business, professional, educational or recreational purposes;
- (21) "Used vehicle dealer," any person who, for commission or with intent to make a profit or gain sells, exchanges, rents with option to purchase, offers or attempts to negotiate a sale or exchange of used vehicles or who is engaged in the business of selling used vehicles; or any person who sells five or more used vehicles or offers for sale five or more used vehicles at the same address or telephone number in any one

2	(22)	"Vehicle," any new or used automobile, truck, truck tractor, motorcycle, motor home,
3		trailer, semitrailer or travel trailer of the type and kind required to be titled and
4		registered under chapters 32-3 and 32-5, except manufactured homes, mobile homes,
5		mopeds or snowmobiles;
6	(23)	"Vehicle dealer," any person who, for commission or with intent to make a profit or
7		gain, sells, exchanges, rents with option to purchase, offers or attempts to negotiate
8		a sale or exchange of new, or new and used vehicles, or who is engaged wholly or in
9		part in the business of selling new, or new and used vehicles;
10	<u>(24)</u>	"Final stage manufacturer dealer," any person who assembles or installs on a
11		previously assembled new motor vehicle chassis cab any special body or equipment
12		that forms an integral part of the motor vehicle, constitutes a major manufacturing
13		alteration, and completes the vehicle;
14	<u>(25)</u>	"Chassis cab," any incomplete motor vehicle, with a completed occupant
15		compartment, that requires only the addition of cargo carrying, work performing, or
16		load bearing components to perform the vehicle's intended function.
17	Section	on 2. That § 32-6B-12 be amended to read as follows:
18	32-6H	3-12. Any dealer's license issued under this chapter shall be of the following classes:
19	(1)	"Vehicle dealer's license," to permit a license that permits the licensee to engage in
20		the business of selling or exchanging new, or new and used, vehicles;
21	(2)	"Used vehicle dealer's license," to permit a license that permits the licensee to engage
22		in the business of selling or exchanging used vehicles only;
23	(3)	"Motorcycle dealer's license," to permit a license that permits the licensee to engage
24		in the business of selling or exchanging new or used motorcycles only;

1	(4)	"Trailer dealer's license," to permit a license that permits the licensee to engage in the		
2		business of selling or exchanging trailers, semitrailers, recreational park trailers, or		
3		travel trailers only, new or used; or		
4	(5)	"Emergency vehicle dealer's license," to permit a license that permits the licensee to		
5		engage in the business of selling or exchanging new or used authorized emergency		
6		vehicles; or		
7	<u>(6)</u>	"Final stage manufacturer dealer's license," a license that permits the licensee to		
8		engage in the business of selling or exchanging a previously assembled new motor		
9		vehicle chassis cab that has been completed by the final stage manufacturer and to		
10		engage in the business of selling or exchanging used motor vehicles.		
11	A license certificate identifying the class of dealership and containing a distinguishing			
12	identification number of licensee shall be issued by the department if the application is in			
13	compliance with the provisions of this chapter.			
14	Section 3. That § 32-6B-13 be amended to read as follows:			
15	32-61	B-13. Upon making initial application for a dealer's license, the applicant shall pay a		
16	fee to the	e department. The initial fee required for each type of dealer's license is as follows:		
17	(1)	Vehicle dealer's license\$300;		
18	(2)	Used vehicle dealer's license\$300;		
19	(3)	Motorcycle dealer's license\$250;		
20	(4)	Trailer dealer's license\$125; or		
21	(5)	Emergency vehicle dealer's license\$300; or		
22	<u>(6)</u>	Final stage manufacturer dealer's license\$300.		
23	All n	noney collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the state motor vehicle		
24	fund.

- 1 Section 4. That § 32-6B-80 be amended to read as follows:
- 2 32-6B-80. Except as otherwise provided by §§ 32-6B-79 to 32-6B-83, inclusive, no
- 3 manufacturer or franchisor may directly or indirectly:
- 4 (1) Own an interest in a vehicle dealer or dealership;
- 5 (2) Operate or control a vehicle dealer or dealership; or
- 6 (3) Act in the capacity of a vehicle dealer.
- 7 This section does not apply to a final stage manufacturer dealer.
