- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide for the sale of the state's interests in certain real
- 2 estate and improvements located at the Human Services Center campus.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. The Department of Social Services may sell the state's interest in the real estate
- 5 and any related personal property and improvements commonly known as the Mead Building
- 6 located on the Human Services Center campus, Yankton County, South Dakota, to the Yankton
- 7 County Historical Society, Inc., upon payment of the appraised value of the real estate and
- 8 improvements as established by the real estate appraisal prepared for the Bureau of
- 9 Administration, Office of State Engineer, dated November 2, 2012. The sale shall be "as is" and
- the department shall provide the purchaser access to the real estate on Human Services Center
- 11 roads.
- 12 Section 2. The proceeds from the sale of the real estate and improvements shall be deposited
- in the permanent fund established by S.D. Const., Art. VIII, § 7 for the use and benefit of the
- 14 Human Services Center.
- 15 Section 3. Upon satisfaction of the conditions in section 1 of this Act, the Governor shall

- 1 execute a quitclaim deed which shall be attested by the Commissioner of School and Public
- 2 Lands, to transfer all of the state's right, title, and interest in the real estate and improvements
- 3 commonly known as the Mead Building, containing approximately 1.24 acres of real property
- 4 located in Tract 1, Lot A, SE 1/4, Section 36, Township 94 North, Range 56 West of the 5th
- 5 P.M. in Yankton County, South Dakota, as described on the plat to be recorded in the Yankton
- 6 County Register of Deeds Office, to the Yankton County Historical Society, Inc., subject to all
- 7 applicable statutory and constitutional reservations.
