- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to ensure notice to the respondent and opportunity for the
- 2 respondent to be heard prior to enforcement of certain foreign domestic protection orders.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 25-10-12.1 be amended to read as follows:
- 5 25-10-12.1. Any domestic violence abuse protection order, or any stalking or physical
- 6 violence protection order, issued by a court of competent jurisdiction of another state, Indian
- 7 tribe, the District of Columbia, or a commonwealth, territory, or possession of the United States
- 8 is enforceable as if the order was issued by a court in this state if all of the following
- 9 requirements are satisfied:
- 10 (1) The respondent received notice of the order in compliance with requirements of the
- issuing jurisdiction;
- 12 (2) The order is in effect in the issuing jurisdiction;
- 13 (3) The issuing court had jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter;
- 14 (4) The respondent was is or has been afforded reasonable notice and opportunity to be

1		heard sufficient to protect that person's right to due process in the issuing jurisdiction.
2		In the case of ex parte orders, notice and opportunity to be heard must have is or has
3		been provided within the time required by the law of the issuing jurisdiction; and, in
4		any event, within a reasonable time after the order was issued, sufficient to protect
5		the respondent's due process rights;
6	(5)	If the order also provides protection for the respondent, a petition, application, or
7		other written pleading was filed with the issuing court seeking such an order and the
8		issuing court made specific findings that the respondent was entitled to the order; and
9	(6)	The prohibited conduct violative of the foreign protection order could be prohibited
10		by a protection order if issued in this state.
11	Anyp	protection order meeting the requirements of this section is a foreign domestic violence
12	abuse pro	otection order or a foreign stalking or physical violence protection order.
