## **FISCAL NOTE**



HB 961 - SB 1232

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Grants POST-certified law enforcement officers, when making an arrest outside of their jurisdiction, the same legal status and immunity from suit as a law enforcement officer making an arrest within their jurisdiction, if the arrest is made under certain circumstances.

## Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 38-3-113, a sworn federal law enforcement officer, who
  in official capacity is authorized by law to make arrests, shall, when making an arrest in
  this state for a nonfederal offense, have the same legal status and immunity from suit as
  a state or local law enforcement officer if the arrest is made under the following
  circumstances:
  - The officer reasonably believes that the person arrested has committed a felony in the officer's presence or is committing a felony in the officer's presence;
  - The officer reasonably believes the person arrested has committed a
    misdemeanor that amounts to a breach of the peace in the officer's presence or is
    committing such a misdemeanor in the officer's presence; or
  - The officer is rendering assistance to a law enforcement officer of this state in an emergency or at the request of the officer.
- Granting the same legal status and immunity from suit under these specific circumstances to POST-certified law enforcement officers will not have a significant impact on total prosecutions or litigation.
- Therefore, this legislation will not result in a significant impact to state or local expenditures.
