## FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 580 – HB 992

April 13, 2017

**SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL:** Requires election officials to ensure that all information that is required on a document is provided prior to accepting the document. Establishes a conclusive presumption that any document accepted by an election official is properly filed and all requirements have been timely met.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

#### **NOT SIGNIFICANT**

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (007129):** Adds language to the original bill to require the Tennessee Registry of Election Finance (TREF) to audit the campaign account of any member of the General Assembly who spends \$175,000 or more during an election cycle for certain expenditures.

#### FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Increase State Expenditures - \$11,000/One-Time \$112,500/Recurring

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Adding the conclusive presumption that documents accepted by an election official are
  properly and timely filed will not result in any significant impact to state or local
  government.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. 2-10-212(a)(2), two percent of all candidates for the General Assembly shall be randomly selected for audit by TREF.
- The proposed language would also require TREF to audit the campaign account of any member of the General Assembly who spends \$175,000 or more during an election cycle for expenditures other than for contributions to a political campaign committee or other candidates.
- TREF will be required to conduct approximately 20 more audits every two years.
- In order to conduct the additional audits, TREF will require one additional auditor and one auditor assistant.

- The hiring of additional staff will result in a recurring increase in state expenditures of \$112,500 for salaries, benefits, office space rental, and network access.
- There will be a one-time increase in state expenditures of \$11,000 for purchasing computers and supplies.
