FISCAL MEMORANDUM

SB 557 - HB 1089

March 26, 2019

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Changes, from persons who reside to persons owning property, the group of qualified voters within an area proposed for annexation who are authorized to vote in the annexation referendum.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006682): Deletes and rewrites all language after the enacting clause such that the substantive changes (1) authorize persons who own property or reside in the territory proposed for annexation to vote in the annexation referendum, and (2) limits the number of persons owning an individual tract of property who are authorized to vote per referendum.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

Unchanged from the original fiscal note.

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- Expanding the eligibility to vote in an annexation referendum is not estimated to significantly alter the current number of persons who would vote in such referendum; therefore, any impact to local government is estimated to be not significant.
