SUMMARY OF BILL AS AMENDED (006046): Requires a direct-to-consumer genetic testing company to provide consumers with essential information about the company's collection, use, and disclosure of genetic data and publicly available privacy notice that includes information about the company's data collection, consent, use, access, disclosure, transfer, security, retention, and deletion practices. Requires a direct-to-consumer genetic testing company to adhere to outlined requirements regarding obtaining a consumer's initial express consent for collection, use, or disclosure of the consumer's genetic data.

Prohibits a direct-to-consumer genetic testing company from disclosing a consumer's genetic data to an entity that offers health insurance, life insurance, or long-term care insurance or an employer of the consumer, without first obtaining the consumer's written consent. Requires the Attorney General and Reporter (AG) to enforce violations and establish a means by which a consumer can submit a complaint for violation.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL AS AMENDED:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Any increase in the number of complaints handled by the AG is estimated to be not significant and can be handled by existing staff during normal work hours.
- Any additional AG duties resulting from the proposed legislation will be absorbed using existing resources.
- Any additional workload on the courts, as a result of this legislation, can be accommodated within existing resources and personnel.

IMPACT TO COMMERCE OF BILL AS AMENDED:
