HB 1322 - SB 1298

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases the fines for failure to operate a motor vehicle properly on approach of emergency vehicle and when approaching certain stationary vehicles (1) from a range of \$100 to \$500 to a range of \$500 to \$1,000 for the first violation; (2) from a range of \$500 to \$1,000 to a range of \$1,000 to \$1,500 for the second violation; and (3) from a minimum of \$1,000 to a minimum of \$1,500 for a third or subsequent violations.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 55-8-132, upon the immediate approach of an authorized emergency vehicle making use of audible and/or visual signals, the driver must yield the right-of-way and pull the driver's vehicle over to the right edge of the roadway until the emergency vehicle has passed. Upon approaching a stationary authorized emergency vehicle, recovery vehicle, highway maintenance vehicle, solid waste vehicle, or utility service vehicle when the vehicle is giving a signal by use of flashing lights, the driver must proceed with due caution and change into a lane not adjacent to the stationary vehicle or reduce the speed of the driver's vehicle. Upon approaching a stationary workicle is giving a signal by use of flashing lights, the driver must proceed with caution and change into a lane not adjacent to the stationary vehicle or reduce the speed of the driver's vehicle.
- Passage of this legislation will not change the number of citations issued; it merely changes the extent of possible fines that may be assessed.
- There will not be a sufficient change for state or local government to experience any significant increase in revenue.
