FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 1626 - SB 1829

June 3, 2020

SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL: Designates June 19 of each year as “Juneteenth” and a legal holiday.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

Increase State Expenditures – Net Impact –
Up to \$647,600/FY20-21 and Subsequent Years

Other Fiscal Impact - To the extent local governments opt to observe the holiday, there will be an unquantifiable permissive recurring increase in local expenditures.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (018136): Deletes and replaces all language after the enacting clause such that June 19 of each year will be recognized as Juneteenth but will not be a legal holiday.

FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumption for the bill as amended:

- The proposed legislation does not declare a legal holiday as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 15-1-101; therefore, the fiscal impact to state or local government is estimated to be not significant.
