HB 2028 - SB 2364

March 10, 2024

SUMMARY OF BILL: Adds training in the use of anti-choking devices to the required training for coaches of school youth activities at a local education agency (LEA) or public charter school.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase Local Expenditures – \$35,500/FY24-25/Permissive

Assumptions:

- Tennessee Code Annotated § 49-6-3601(b)(1)(C) requires coaches of school youth activities at an LEA or public charter school to receive training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and in the use of automated external defibrillators.
- National and local organizations that provide first aid training do not provide anti-choking device training. Anti-choking device vendors may provide free training for schools when purchasing devices, but the extent of any such training is unknown.
- Because anti-choking device training would be difficult to administer without an available device, it is assumed that LEAs will elect to purchase at least one anti-choking device.
- It is estimated that the permissive increase in local expenditures will be \$35,520 (148 LEAs x \$240) in FY24-25.
- Because the anti-choking devices will be used for training purposes only, the operational life of the device will exceed what is typically expected while used in schools; therefore, the replacement costs were not factored into this analysis.
