FISCAL NOTE

HB 2062 - SB 2665

February 29, 2024

SUMMARY OF BILL: Creates a Street Racing Task Force to determine best practices for curbing illegal street racing, the local resources needed for such practices, and whether state legislation is needed to implement them. Requires the task force to be administratively attached to the Department of Safety (DOS). Establishes that members of the task force serve without compensation for their services, but must be reimbursed for travel and other expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties. Requires the commissioner of the DOS to call the first meeting no later than August 1, 2024. Requires the first meeting to be in person, but authorizes subsequent meetings to be conducted electronically. Requires the task force to report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly by January 15, 2025. Terminates the task force on January 15, 2025.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Increase State Expenditures – \$5,800/FY24-25

Assumptions:

- It is assumed the task force will conduct the first meeting in person on August 1, 2024 in Nashville, TN. It is assumed that all subsequent meetings of the task force will be conducted electronically.
- The task force is comprised of 17 members, 13 of which are assumed to be required to travel to Nashville and require reimbursements for travel and other expenses for the first meeting in August.
- The increase in state expenditures in FY24-25 is as follows:

- It is assumed the DOS can support the task force administratively within existing department resources. The final report can be submitted within those resources.
