**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Requires the Department of Safety and Homeland Security (DOS) to include a designation on the driver license or photo identification of persons convicted of human trafficking sufficient to enable law enforcement to identify them as such.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Other Fiscal Impact - To the extent the redesign of the driver license card can be accomplished with one of the two allowances permitted by the current third-party vendor contract, the proposed legislation will not result in a significant increase in expenditures. Otherwise, redesign of the card will result in a one-time increase in state expenditures of approximately \$20,000.**

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation will require changes to both the DOS's credential issuance system and the A-List driver license system.
- Based on information provided by the DOS, and confirmed by the third-party contract vendor responsible for the credential issuance system, the contract with the third-party vendor contains a provision that allows up to two card changes per year at no additional charge.
- According to DOS, the department has one available update remaining that could be utilized for these purposes. To the extent the redesign of the driver license card can be accomplished with one of the two allowances permitted by the current third-party vendor contract, any further impact will not result in a significant increase in expenditures. Otherwise, redesign of the card will result in a one-time increase in state expenditures of approximately \$20,000.
- It is assumed that any required updates to the A-List driver license system can be accomplished by the relevant vendor under the current contractual agreement without a need for additional expenditures; therefore, any fiscal impact to DOS is estimated to be not significant.
