FISCAL NOTE

HB 2736 - SB 2719

February 15, 2024

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires a chief executive officer of an administrative department of state government to have lived in Tennessee for a minimum of 30 days prior to selection for such position and to satisfy all statutory requirements for the position.

Authorizes the General Assembly to remove a chief executive officer of an administrative department of state government for cause upon passage of a joint resolution of the General Assembly, including for, but not limited to, the following reasons: commission of a crime or misdemeanor, knowing or willful misconduct, knowing or willful neglect of statutory duties, and failure to meet statutory qualifications for such office. Removal by the General Assembly requires a two-thirds vote.

FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- It is assumed that the authority granted to the General Assembly by this legislation will rarely, if at all, be exercised.
- If the General Assembly decides to remove a chief executive officer of an administrative department, it is assumed that such action will take place during a regularly scheduled legislative session.
- Removal of any such officer and subsequent filling of the vacated position will have minimal impact on state government operations.
