FISCAL NOTE

HB 2741 - SB 2862

March 26, 2024

SUMMARY OF BILL: Creates a Class E felony offense, punishable only by a fine of \$50,000, to manufacture, distribute, possess with the intent to distribute, install, use, or sell a motor vehicle with a remote vehicle disabling technology that is capable of being activated or engaged by a passenger motor vehicle manufacturer or government entity. Authorizes the Motor Vehicle Commission to deny any application for a motor vehicle sales license or revoke or suspend any license after it has been issued upon finding the applicant or licensee has been convicted of such offense.

FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- This Class E felony is punishable by fine only; therefore, no increase in state expenditures related to incarceration costs.
- Based on the Fiscal Review Committee's 2008 study and the Administrative Office of the Courts' 2012 study on collection of court costs, fees, and fines, collection in criminal cases is insignificant. The proposed legislation will not significantly change state or local revenue.
- Any impact on state revenue or expenditures associated with revocation or prohibition of issuance of motor vehicle sales licenses is estimated to be not significant.
