**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Requires the Tennessee Investment in Student Achievement (TISA) formula to provide funding for one full-time, licensed professional school counselor position for each 250 students or one full-time position for each Local Education Agency (LEA), whichever is greater.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

**Other Fiscal Impact - For local education agencies who are required to hire additional school counselors, a mandatory shift in funding will occur. However, due to multiple unknown variables, a precise fiscal impact cannot reasonably be determined.**

Assumptions:

- There are currently 1,854 schools in Tennessee and the minimum number of counselors to be funded by the proposed legislation would be 1,854.
- TISA is a student-based funding formula and does not contain a salary component.
- While funding for counselors is included in current TISA estimates, the exact dollar amount cannot be determined.
- The average position cost is estimated to be \$68,939.
- It is estimated that the total cost to fund the number of proposed counselors would be \$127,812,906 in FY23-24 and subsequent years.
- The state share would be \$89,469,034 ( $\$127,812,906 \times 70\%$ ) and the aggregate local share would be \$38,343,872 ( $\$127,812,906 \times 30\%$ ) in FY23-24 and subsequent years.
- Due to TISA's funding structure, the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation cannot be determined.
- LEA's have broad discretion on how these funds are expended, and it is unknown how many LEAs currently have a sufficient number of school counselors to meet the requirements of the proposed legislation.
- For LEAs who are required to hire additional school counselors, a mandatory shift in funding will occur. However, due to multiple unknown variables, a precise fiscal impact cannot reasonably be determined.
