**FISCAL MEMORANDUM**

**SB 413 – HB 952**

March 30, 2017

**SUMMARY OF ORIGINAL BILL:** Creates the “Visiting Sports Team Act.” Exempts a physician who is duly qualified to practice medicine under the law of another state from licensure requirements in Tennessee when dealing with a sports team.

FISCAL IMPACT OF ORIGINAL BILL:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

**SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT (006466):** Deletes and rewrites the proposed legislation such that the only substantive change is authorizing an exempt physician under this section to administer controlled substances, if the patient to whom the controlled substance is administered or dispensed is over 18 years of age and is a person described in subdivision (a)(1) or (a)(2) of the proposed legislation; and the physician reports all controlled substances dispensed or administered to any applicable state controlled substance database in the physician's state of licensure.

**FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL WITH PROPOSED AMENDMENT:**

**Unchanged from the original fiscal note.**

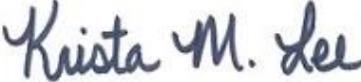
Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- Sports teams that do not bring their own physician rely on existing medical professionals on sight at these sporting events.
- Sports teams that do bring their own physician are not taking the steps to become licensed in Tennessee.
- Based on information provided by the Department of Health, the proposed legislation will not have a significant impact on licensure fees; therefore, any fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
