## FISCAL NOTE

## SB 707 - HB 1010

March 1, 2023

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Decreases the population threshold, from 25,000 to 20,000, below which two or more cities may agree to jointly engage one building inspector.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

#### **NOT SIGNIFICANT**

## Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 6-54-116, two or more municipalities may engage jointly one building inspector, so long as neither city exceeds 25,000 in population.
- The proposed legislation would lower the population threshold to 20,000.
- Based on the 2020 federal census, there are currently 317 cities with a population less than 25,000. Lowering the population cap to 20,000 residents would disqualify four of those cities.
- It is not known if the four applicable cities currently engage a joint building inspector with another city; however, due to the relatively small portion of the state that would be affected, any increase in local expenditures is estimated to be not significant.
