**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 855 - SB 718**

February 9, 2019

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Increases, from 10 working days to 15 calendar days, the time period after receiving a written appeal, that the state fire marshal must issue a decisive ruling over a conflict between a county and a city regarding a building or fire code issue that involves a county building located within a city.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumption:

- Extending the time period in which the state fire marshal must issue a ruling in a conflict between a county and a city will have no significant impact on the Division of Fire Prevention of the Department of Commerce and Insurance or the local government.
