**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 893 - SB 1028**

March 3, 2021

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Permits a person who was convicted of a nonviolent offense committed prior to January 1, 1980 and received a pardon to have the person's criminal records related to the offense expunged.

**ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 40-32-101(h)(1), an eligible petitioner means a person who was convicted of a nonviolent crime after January 1, 1980, if the person petitioned the court and the judge finds that the offense was a nonviolent crime, petitioned for and received a positive vote from the Board of Parole to receive a pardon, and received a pardon by the governor.
- There will not be a significant number of people who would be eligible under this legislation to substantially increase local revenue from expungement fees.
