SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes a child to be detained in a secure facility or secure portion of a facility if there is probable cause to believe that the child has committed a delinquent offense constituting: burglary, aggravated burglary, especially aggravated burglary or theft of a motor vehicle. Removes the specification stating that courts are authorized to order detention for a maximum of 48 hours for a delinquent child placed in an institution, camp, or other facility for delinquent children be served on only the days that the school in which the child is enrolled is not in session.

ESTIMATED FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Any fiscal impact to state or local government resulting from the authorization to detain children in secure facilities in outlined circumstances is estimated to be not significant.
- Any fiscal impact resulting from removing the specification of court orders as they pertain to detention of a child placed in an institution, camp, or other facility on days school is not in session is estimated to be not significant.
