FISCAL NOTE

SB 1842 - HB 2053

February 1, 2024

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires clerks of state and local courts to notify the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) by electronic submission of final disposition of criminal proceedings against a person as soon as practicable but no later than three business days, rather than within 72 hours.

FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 18-4-103(9), 18-4-203(b)(4), and 16-18-310(c), clerks of state and local courts are required to notify the TBI by electronic submission of final disposition of criminal proceedings against a person as soon as practicable, but no later than 72 hours. The proposed legislation changes this requirement to no later than three business days.
- It is assumed the change will make it somewhat easier for clerks of court to meet this requirement. However, it will not result in a significant reduction in their workload.
- Any fiscal impact to TBI or local government is estimated to be not significant.
