FISCAL NOTE

SB 2095 - HB 2286

February 10, 2022

SUMMARY OF BILL: Authorizes a court or clerk to waive an in-person fiduciary oath pertaining to a guardianship or conservatorship, if certain conditions are met. Requires appointed conservators complete court-approved training prior to a letter of guardianship or conservatorship being issued. Requires the court-approved training be free and easily accessible through internet access. Provides exemption for a public guardian.

FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- The proposed legislation establishes the following as acceptable training that can be approved by the court:
 - Videos or written materials prepared and updated by the Conservatorship Association of Tennessee;
 - Videos or written materials prepared and updated by the Office of Conservatorship Management for Metropolitan Nashville & Davidson County; or
 - Videos or written materials prepared and updated by the court or clerk for each respective county.
- The Office of Conservatorship Management for Metropolitan Nashville & Davidson County currently has various educational material and videos available for free on its website.
- Any additional workload on the courts, as a result of this legislation, can be accommodated within existing resources and personnel.
