FISCAL NOTE

SB 2250 - HB 2345

SUMMARY OF BILL: Requires each local education agency (LEA) to allow nonresident students who apply to enroll in a school within the LEA if space is available under certain circumstances. Authorizes a fee to be charged to such students. Authorizes an appeal process for nonresident students who are denied enrollment.

FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Tennessee Code Annotated § 49-2-128(f)(2) already authorizes nonresident students to be enrolled in an LEA after all other applications have been acted upon.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-6-3003, tuition and fees may be charged to nonresident students.
- The total number of students admitted during an LEA's open enrollment period cannot exceed the amount of space available for additional students. Therefore, allowing non-resident students to participate in an LEAs open enrollment process will not significantly affect the total number of students admitted.
- Any change in student enrollment as a result of this legislation is projected to be within the annual student enrollment range that fluctuates on an annual basis. Any local fiscal impact is estimated to be not significant.
- No change to the BEP.
