**FISCAL NOTE**

**HB 2175 - SB 2425**

February 8, 2022

**SUMMARY OF BILL:** Removes language in statute limiting the fee for inspection of any elevator, dumbwaiter, escalator, or moving walk from exceeding \$100. Furthermore, removes language limiting the inspection fee of any aerial passenger tramway from exceeding \$200.

Removes the annual maximum construction permit fee, maximum annual acceptance inspection fee and maximum annual follow-up inspection fee, each being \$300, for each new or altered elevator, dumbwaiter, escalator, moving walk, or aerial passenger tramway.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

**NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions:

- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 68-121-103 (a) – (b), the Elevator and Amusement Device Safety Board has the duty, power, authority, and responsibility to regulate aerial passenger tramways, elevators, dumbwaiters, and escalators and may prescribe fee for construction permits, operating permits, acceptance inspections, initial inspections, and periodic inspections for the aforementioned devices, rather new or existing.
- Based on information from the Department of Labor and Workforce Development, this legislation largely removes antiquated language and thereby, removes conflicts between statute and rules of the Board.
- This legislation is estimated to have no significant impact on the fees currently levied by the Board; therefore, no impact to state government.

**IMPACT TO COMMERCE:**
