FISCAL NOTE

HB 2118 – SB 2539

January 31, 2024

SUMMARY OF BILL: Increases the number of members on the State Energy Policy Council (SEPC) from 15 to 17.

FISCAL IMPACT:

NOT SIGNIFICANT

Assumptions:

- Members of the SEPC receive no compensation for their service on the council, but are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses incurred as part of their duties.
- The SEPC is administratively attached to the Comptroller of the Treasury (COT).
- The SEPC has met the following times over the past three fiscal years:
 - FY20-21: six meetings held virtually;
 - FY21-22: three meetings, one of which was held in-person; and
 - FY22-23: five meetings, one of which was held in-person.
- According to the COT, no member requested reimbursement for either of the in-person meetings.
- Assuming that the SEPC continues meeting virtually the majority of the time and the new members do not request reimbursement for any in-person meetings, it is estimated that adding two members will not result in any significant impact to state expenditures.
