## FISCAL MEMORANDUM

HB 2645 - SB 2854

March 7, 2022

**SUMMARY OF BILL AS AMENDED (014635):** Authorizes the creation of a decentralized organization (DO) as a limited liability company (LLC) and prescribes how a DO may be formed, organized, operated, amended, managed, and dissolved. Authorizes an LLC formed under the Tennessee Revised Limited Liability Company Act to convert to a DO by amending its articles of organization. Requires a DO to have and continuously maintain in this state a registered agent just as LLCs do. Authorizes the Secretary of State (SOS) to dissolve a DO if the DO is deemed to no longer perform a lawful purpose; requires the DO to execute a statement of intent to dissolve in the form prescribed by the SOS. Prohibits the SOS from issuing a certificate of authority for DO based outside of the United States or its territories.

### FISCAL IMPACT OF BILL AS AMENDED:

#### **NOT SIGNIFICANT**

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- LLCs are not governmental entities so any impact to state or local government is estimated to be not significant.
- Pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 48-203-102 and § 48-249-109, LLCs must register with the Secretary of State and maintain a registered agent in the state. Authorizing the creation of DOs and LLCs to convert to a DO is not expected to result in a significant number of DOs registering in the state and, therefore, will not result in any significant impact to state government.
- LLCs are required to file a notice of dissolution with the SOS; requiring a DO to file a statement of intent is not expected to result in any impact to state expenditures.
- Prohibiting the SOS from issuing certificates of authority for DOs based outside of the United States will not have any impact to state government.

#### IMPACT TO COMMERCE OF BILL AS AMENDED:

Other Commerce Impact – The extent and timing of any impact to jobs and commerce in Tennessee cannot reasonably be determined.

Assumptions for the bill as amended:

- The proposed legislation provides that a DO may form and operate for a lawful purpose, whether for profit or not for profit.
- Authorizing the creation of DOs in this state may result in an increase to jobs and commerce in Tennessee; however, the extent and timing of such increases cannot reasonably be determined.
