HOUSE BILL 889

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 2, Chapter 16, Part 1 and Title 3, relative to redistricting.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 3, Chapter 4, is amended by adding the following language as a new section:

- (a) As used in this section:
- (1) "Final redistricting plan" means the end proposal of a redistricting committee:
- (2) "Redistricting" means the process of redrawing state legislative and congressional district boundaries;
- (3) "Redistricting committee" means a standing committee, select or special committee, or ad hoc committee of either house or of both houses of the general assembly charged with the development of a redistricting plan following a federal decennial census; and
- (4) "Redistricting plan" means a proposal that contains redrawn state legislative districts, congressional districts, or both state legislative and congressional districts.
- (b) Upon appointment of a redistricting committee, there must be a publicly accessible redistricting committee page on the website of the general assembly for redistricting related information, including meeting notices and redistricting plans.
- (c) Prior to January of each year ending in one (1) beginning in 2021, a redistricting committee shall hold at least one (1) public meeting in each grand division of

the state to solicit input from individuals, groups, and communities on the development of a redistricting plan.

- (d) Prior to final action on a bill comprising a final redistricting plan in a full standing committee with subject matter jurisdiction over redistricting, a thirty-day period for public comment must be observed beginning on the date the final redistricting plan is published on the redistricting committee page of the website of the general assembly.
- (e) In accordance with § 3-1-118, all meetings of a redistricting committee must be open to the public.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring

it.
