WHEREAS, Neal Jackson, a man of true character and commitment, exemplifies dedication and leadership, and he is admired by his fellow Tennesseans for his tireless efforts to

excel, always guided by solid principles and high standards, whether in the athletic arena or in the actions of his daily life; now, therefore,
