WHEREAS, a graduate of Campbellsville High School, Dean Dickey honorably served this country in Pusan, Korea, as a member of the United States Army; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dickey was the owner and operator of seven supermarkets in Middle
Tennessee for twenty-seven years; he also held management positions in the Tennessee
Department of Labor for five years and served as the business services manager at the Maury
County Career Center; and

WHEREAS, an accomplished leader, he was instrumental in the establishment of the Tennessee Grocers Association and the Tennessee Grocers Education Foundation, and he served as chair of the Million Dollar Endowment Drive for Columbia State Community College; he has served on the boards of the National Grocers Association, Columbia State Foundation, Nashville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization Executive Committee, South Central Development District, and South Central Human Resource Agency; and

WHEREAS, a twenty-one-year member of American Legion Post 19, Dean Dickey has worked with a number of organizations, including the Chamber of Commerce, United Way, American Red Cross, and Kiwanis Club of Columbia; he is a former trustee of Baptist Healing Trust and a past board member of Baptist Hospital; and

WHEREAS, no stranger to honors and awards, Mr. Dickey was the recipient of the Paul Harris Fellow award from the Breakfast Rotary and the George F. Hixon Fellowship from the Kiwanis Club of Columbia; he was also honored with a scholarship endowment, known as the H. Dean Dickey Scholarship; and

WHEREAS, Dean Dickey evinces his devout religious faith as a member of First Baptist Church; and

WHEREAS, he is grateful for the love and support he shares with his wife, Joann, and his children, Debbie Nowlin and Mike Dickey; he is the proud grandfather of Leslie McBroom, Andrew Nowlin, Patrick Nowlin, John Dickey, and Caroline Dickey and the doting great-

grandfather of Sutton McBroom, Crosby Edward McBroom, Oaks Russell Nowlin, and Camden Vernon Nowlin; and

WHEREAS, Dean Dickey is wholly committed to the noble precepts of public service that have earned Tennessee recognition as the Volunteer State, and he should be specially recognized; now, therefore,
