WHEREAS, since 1919, the United States of America has officially observed November 11th as Veterans Day, paying respectful tribute to the gallant men and women who have so valiantly served our great nation; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE CONCURRING, that we honor and commend the veterans of Marshall County, recognizing their valor and sacrifice in service to our nation.
