WHEREAS, after stepping down from operating her own restaurants, Sue Malone was a hostess for four years at Shoney's and a waitress at Cracker Barrel for six years; she was named waitress of the year at the age of seventy-five; and

WHEREAS, shortly after the death of her husband and her retirement at the age of seventy-nine, Sue Malone was encouraged by her daughter to get involved at the Fair Park Senior Center, where she was challenged to enter her first beauty pageant; and

WHEREAS, at eighty years young, Mrs. Malone was crowned the 1996 Ms. Senior Cumberland County and was named Miss Congeniality in the Ms. Senior Upper Cumberland Pageant in Cookeville; for her talent, she wore a Charleston flapper girl dress and wowed the crowd by dancing "The Charleston"; and

WHEREAS, eager to explore faraway places, Sue Malone traveled around the globe in her eighties and nineties, visiting England, Italy, France, Switzerland, Austria, Germany, the Caribbean, Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii, and Alaska; and

WHEREAS, Sue Malone is perhaps most appreciative of the love and support she shares with her four daughters, Gail, Louise, Peggy, and Deborah; she is the beloved "Mamaw" to her fourteen grandchildren, twenty-five great-grandchildren, and nine great-great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, as Mrs. Malone approaches her eleventh decade, she is still an active and productive member of society, serving on the board of directors of the Ms. Senior Tennessee pageant; in 2014, she was awarded the honorary title of Ms. Senior Universe; and

WHEREAS, we wish to grasp this golden opportunity to specially recognize one of Tennessee's most outstanding citizens on this very special occasion; now, therefore,
