department as he led his fellow officers through the tragic Gatlinburg fires of 2016 and saved countless lives; and

WHEREAS, no stranger to accolades, Police Chief Randall Brackins was recently honored at the annual Tennessee Association of Chiefs of Police conference in Chattanooga with the organization's Joe Casey Award; the highest honor to be bestowed upon a chief of police in Tennessee, the award is given to recognize an individual who has brought honor and distinction to the Tennessee Association of Chiefs of Police through their character, efforts, guidance, dedication, generosity, and infinite concern for the organization; and

WHEREAS, Chief Brackins is a faithful member of Richardson's Cove Baptist Church and is deeply devoted to his family as a loving husband, father, and grandfather, who is affectionately known as "Papaw" to his seven grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Chief Randall Brackins has performed his duties with professionalism and integrity, helping his fellow citizens in any way that he could and proving himself time and again to be a tremendous asset to the Gatlinburg Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Chief Brackins exemplifies the spirit and allegiance to community that are characteristic of a true Tennessean; and
