WHEREAS, his single, "Little Rock," discussed the subject of addiction recovery, and inspired over 100,000 calls to Alcoholics Anonymous from listeners seeking help in their addictions: and

WHEREAS, perhaps dearest and closest to his heart is the organization he founded with his daughter after the loss of a beloved grandchild, The Haley Bell Blessed Chair Foundation.

The Foundation supports and assists families of the cognitively and physically disabled, providing wheelchairs and other necessary medical equipment; and

WHEREAS, a longtime Nashville resident who released his autobiography in 2014, Collin Raye celebrates twenty-five years of award-winning music in 2016, and he continues to record and write; and

WHEREAS, Collin Raye's influence on country music is truly incomparable, with his music serving as an inspiration to artists, musicians, and fans alike; and

WHEREAS, it is most fitting that this General Assembly should pause in its deliberations to acknowledge and applaud Collin Raye for his many contributions to country music; now, therefore,
