A RESOLUTION to designate October 12, 2018, as a "Day of Remembrance for Douglas Milford Lyons" in Tennessee.

WHEREAS, Douglas Milford Lyons was born on November 27, 1892, to Thomas Nicholas and Ida Champion Lyons in Tharpe; and

WHEREAS, Douglas Milford Lyons served as a teacher in Stewart County and resided in Fort Henry; and

WHEREAS, Douglas Milford Lyons became a true Tennessee Volunteer by joining the United States Army in 1917 and served with the 114<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 29<sup>th</sup> Division; and WHEREAS, Sergeant Douglas Milford Lyons volunteered for officer training to become a Lieutenant while serving near Verdun, France, during World War I; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Douglas Milford Lyons inspired his men in battle with courageous leadership and fearlessness in attacking the enemy position and was killed in action; and

WHEREAS, Douglas Milford Lyons was posthumously awarded the United States

Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism in action on October 12, 1918; and

WHEREAS, Douglas Milford Lyons was laid to rest in the Fort Donelson National

Cemetery in Dover; and

WHEREAS, the Douglas Milford Lyons American Legion Post 72 in Stewart County was named in his honor on September 26, 1930; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDRED
TENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING, that we hereby designate October 12, 2018, as a "Day of Remembrance for

Douglas Milford Lyons" in Tennessee and encourage all citizens to join in this worthy observance.
