WHEREAS, a devoted daughter, sister, and friend, Ambria McGregor lived her life with courage, compassion, and enthusiasm, and her benevolent spirit will continue to serve as an inspiration for others; and

WHEREAS, Ambria will be sorely missed by all those who were blessed to know and love her, and it is fitting that we should remember the effervescent life of this beloved young woman; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRTEENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we honor the memory of Ambria Dianne McGregor, expressing our deepest sympathy and offering our condolences to her family.
