WHEREAS, however, the team feels that Dylan would have been proud of the win. "It's bittersweet," said junior Eric Belew, "I can't put it into words, but this is what he wanted. It means the world to us and it means the world to Dylan's family, but most importantly it means the world to Dylan"; and

WHEREAS, the team put on impressive displays on both sides of the ball, with both the defensive and offensive Most Valuable Player awards going to senior tailback and linebacker Tra'Darius Goff, who rushed for eighty-three yards and three touchdowns and recorded seventeen tackles with a sack; and

WHEREAS, Coach Belew's leadership and passion for the game are without question, and his principles of playing tenacious defense, controlling the ball on offense, and limiting mistakes were on display throughout the Lions' season; and

WHEREAS, the Columbia Central High School football team, in both victory and defeat, has displayed the tenacity, camaraderie, and skill befitting one of the State's finest athletic teams; and

WHEREAS, this General Assembly finds it appropriate to pause in its deliberations to acknowledge and applaud the 2010 Columbia Central High School football team, not only for the team's championship win but for the players' superior sportsmanship and the joy they have brought to their fellow students and the people of Tennessee; now, therefore,
