A RESOLUTION to recognize Mary Jane Crockett-Green on the occasion of her retirement from the Tennessee State Museum.

WHEREAS, throughout her estimable career, Mary Jane Crockett-Green has demonstrated the utmost professionalism, ability, and integrity, winning the unbridled respect and admiration of her colleagues and a grateful public; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED ELEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that we commend Mary Jane Crockett-Green for her honorable and dedicated

service to the State of Tennessee and its citizens upon her retirement from the Tennessee State Museum and extend to her our best wishes for every continued success in her future endeavors.
