

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 983

A RESOLUTION to commend First National Bank of Oneida upon its recognition as a Centennial Tennessee Company.

WHEREAS, First National Bank of Oneida has become a leading force of local economic and educational growth, and although it has had several homes over the years, the bank moved to its current location at the corner of North Main Street and Alberta Street in 2022; and

WHEREAS, it is most fitting that we recognize this stalwart Tennessee business on this special occasion; now, therefore,
