BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED SIXTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, that we hereby honor and commend Sarah Bayless for her meritorious service to the State of Tennessee, congratulate her on her
