### 111TH CONGRESS 1ST SESSION H.R. 1122

To require the Secretary of the Interior to plan, design, and construct a new school at Third Mesa, Arizona, on the Hopi Indian Reservation.

## A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Interior to plan, design, and construct a new school at Third Mesa, Arizona, on the Hopi Indian Reservation.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Hopi School Replace-

5 ment Act of 2009".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds as follows:

- 8 (1) The Hopi Tribe is located approximately 90
- 9 miles northeast of the City of Flagstaff in Northern

Arizona. The Hopi Tribe is the only non-gaming In dian tribe in Arizona and, therefore, has no other fi nancial resources with which to improve the condi tions of its schools.

5 (2) The current school facilities have numerous 6 structural deficiencies that create at-risk conditions 7 for occupants and neither provides an appropriate 8 environment as compared to off-reservation facilities.

9 (3) Both school facilities are over 125 years old
10 and have been described by two different Bureau of
11 Indian Affairs inspections as having exceeded their
12 usefulness and functional life.

# 13 SEC. 3. THIRD MESA, ARIZONA, NEW SCHOOL CONSTRUC14 TION.

Not later than 3 years after funds are made available
for this section, the Secretary of the Interior, in coordination with the Hopi Tribe, shall plan, design, and construct
a new school at Third Mesa, Arizona, on the Hopi Indian
Reservation, to replace the Hopi Day School and the
Hotevilla Bacavi Community School.
